


Adam and Eve's family grew. There were many people in the world, and all of them chose to sin, or disobey God.

But God showed kindness to a man named Noah. Noah followed God.




God told Noah to build a really big boat, called an ark, to keep Noah's family and all kinds of animals safe from the flood.
